

## Other ways of saying **WALK**



**stroll** to walk for pleasure and without hurrying: đi dạo, đi tản bộ

Ex: They were strolling through the park, chatting about old times.

**wander** to walk without a specific purpose: đi rong chơi, đi lang thang

I found him wandering in the street without a coat.

**march** to walk in a military way or with a lot of energy: hành quân, diễu hành

He marched right in and demanded to see the manager.



**stride** to walk fast, taking big steps: đi rảo bước

He strode off toward the lake, and Mary ran after him.

**step** to move one foot forward: đi từng bước một

He stepped cautiously into the room.

**creep** to try not to make any noise as you walk because you do not want people to notice

you: đi rón rón

He crept out of the bedroom and down the stairs.

**swagger** to walk as if you think you are very important: đi nghênh ngang

A self-important man in a brand new uniform pushed open the door and swaggered in.

**trudge** to walk slowly and with effort, as if you are very tired or have been walking for a long time: đi một cách mệt mỏi, lê từng bước

She trudged up the hill, bent under a heavy backpack.



**shuffle** to walk slowly, without lifting your feet off the ground: lê bước

She just shuffles around the house complaining about her cold.

**stagger** to walk with uneven steps, almost falling over: đi lảo đảo

She managed to stagger to a phone before collapsing on the floor.
